- 4 **EAT** a peach in memory of T. S. Eliot, who died 40 years ago today. The poet's "The Waste Land" is still considered the 20th century's most influential work of poetry.
- 5 **HAIL** the King. Chicago's House of Blues celebrates rock 'n' roll Lorraine Elvira Presley with a 70th-birthday spectacular. 
- 6 **KICK** back and enjoy over 200 films from more than 60 countries as the Palm Springs International Film Festival opens tonight. 
- 7  **REV** your engines at the Los Angeles Auto Show. Your new Prius will look positively vintage next to these high-concept cars of the future.
- 8 **BRING** your "Brava"s to Tony Award winner Audra McDonald's one-woman show, which kicks off Lincoln Center's American Songbook series, at Time Warner Center's Rose Theater, in N.Y.C.
- 9 **CHEW** on this. "Underfoot," Irving Penn's new series of photographs of discarded chewing gum on New York City sidewalks, is on view at the Fraenkel Gallery, in San Francisco.
- 10  **REVERE** George Plimpton. Log on to *The Paris Review's* archived interviews from the 60s with writers such as Nabokov, Mailer, and Bellow ([theparisreview.org](http://theparisreview.org)).
- 11  **PLAY** with Barbies modeled after the Juicy Couture creators. Proceeds benefit Childhelp USA and the National Foundation for Facial Reconstruction.
- 12 **PERUSE** Civil War artifacts and discover the foodways and dining customs of South Carolina's 18th- and 19th-century Low Country, in exhibitions at the Charleston Museum.
- 13 **LOOK** up. Colorful hot-air balloons decorate the sky while thousands of spectators dot the streets in Filzmoos, Austria, for the International Hot Air Balloon Week. 
- 14 **WAX** your skis. The 75th International Lauberhorn Races, including the globe's oldest and longest World Cup downhill, start today in Wengen, Switzerland.
- 15  **CONQUER** ice, rock, and your fear of heights at the 10th annual Ouray Ice Festival, a four-day event in Ouray, Colorado.
- 16 **PULL** on your mukluks. Ernest Shackleton's expedition discovered the magnetic South Pole on this day in 1909. 
- 17 **HONOR** civil-rights pioneers. To coincide with Martin Luther King Jr. Day, the first Jimmy Winkfield Stakes, named after the late black jockey, will be held at Aqueduct Racetrack, in Jamaica, New York.
- 18 **WEAR** it. Now hear about it. The Otis School of Fashion Design, in Los Angeles, hosts a presentation and Q&A with Todd Oldham as part of its Inside the Designer's Studio lecture series.
- 19 **BUNDLE** up. Grindelwald, Switzerland, is home to the World Snow Festival, where artists carve magnificent ice sculptures in the center of town and then chat with visitors for four days.
- 20  **SALUTE** the commander in chief. The presidential procession rolls down Pennsylvania Avenue to the Capitol. It's Inauguration Day.
- 21 **HOOK** your catch at Lure Fishbar, the latest venture from New York restaurateurs John McDonald and Josh Pickard, the guys behind the Über-swanky eatery Lever House.
- 22 **GARDEN** away, because Martha can't. Follow 70,000 green-thumb enthusiasts into downtown Denver as the 46th annual Colorado Garden & Home Show begins. 
- 23 **FEEL** torn between familial duty and personal growth. Tony Award winner Sutton Foster stars in the stage version of Louisa May Alcott's *Little Women* at Broadway's Virginia Theatre.
- 24 **BROWSE** and bundle up. New York's Seventh Regiment Armory opens its doors for the fabulous 51st annual Winter Antiques Show.
- 25 **PICK** your winners for Oscar night. The nominations are announced today for the 77th annual Academy Awards.
- 26  **BOX** a kangaroo. It's Australia Day! Festivities abound Down Under as the didgeridoo heralds the anniversary of the founding of the colony, in 1788.
- 27 **REVIVE** your inner French nerd. The International Comics Festival opens in Angoulême, France, in the heart of the Charente region.
- 28 **GILD** your Halloween costume. Indulge in tasteful depravity—Carnevale di Venezia begins today. 
- 29 **TRY** to secure an audience seat. It's Oprah's 51st birthday. 
- 30 **TUNE** in. *Pompeii: The Last Day*, the BBC's highest-rated history program ever, airs tonight in the States, on the Discovery Channel.
- 31 **LOSE** yourself in the depths of Rembrandt's brooding and pensive religious portraits, in an exhibition at the National Gallery of Art, in Washington, D.C.
